23 and I was reading the life of Napoleon. He hated the French. He come over into France, born out on a island, and come to France to get even with them, but become a great conqueror. He was a gentleman, to start with. But success went to his head.

<u>27</u> 19 Victory of that type don't last, because it's not wrought right. You can never get good out of wrong. You've got to play the rule of the game fair.

20 And any one of you know, that in olympics or any other athletical exercises,

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no matter if you arrive first in the race, but if you haven't played the game according to the rules, you're disqualified. You have to play the rule right.

29 21 And that's the way it is with human life. You can't play the rules of the game of life wrong and expect to win. You've got to play it according to God's Word and the purpose that you were brought here for.

<u>30</u> 22 Now, there is so many people that doesn't seem to have any kind of a purpose in life, especially in this day that we now live. People just seem to think that all they have to do is to keep up with somebody else, with the fashions of the world,

<u>31</u> and with the enticements that the world has given to them. 23 Just like this, if you go to school and some of the little girls wear a certain little frock, or dress, or whatever you would call it, all the

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ambition the rest of the school has is to pattern after that girl. Some of the women see on the television some certain lady come out, and dressed in a certain fashion, well, that's their ambition is to dress and to act like that.

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And that seems to be just about the limit of the American ambition, is to get a new job, or to get a raise in your salary, and to get a television,

or a new car.

24 Let me say this. Those things may be all right, but there's higher

34 <u>ambitions in the human life than those</u> things. And Christians should set their affection on higher ambitions. 25 I think it would pay us all to sit down and wonder why we are here, in the first place. And ever Who was kind

enough to bring us here,

35 we ought to consider and ask Him what He would have us to

do, the purpose of us coming, to fulfill what He has purposed for us. But we seem to be just

wanting to keep up with the

world.

<u>36</u> 26 Now, the Bible said that we can overcome the world. And how do we do it? Not by keeping up with the fashions of the world. But the Bible said that faith is the victory that overcomes the world.

<u>48</u> <u>God cannot. It's impossible</u> for God to fail, and remain God. He has to, to do that.

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53-0511 - We Have Found Him, Come And See 21 Then He's here. Is that right? He said, "Wherever two or three are gathered," no matter how small a group, two or three, "I'll be in their midst. What anything they ask, shall receive it."

50 Now, that's either right or it's wrong. Jesus said, "If ye abide in Me, and My Word in you, you can ask what you will, it'll done to you. Whatsoever things you desire when you pray, believe you receive it." That's...

<u>53</u> When you come to the altar to pray to be forgiven your sins, it isn't 'cause you cry, it isn't because you confess. It's because you believe. And when you believe and stand up and testify...Now, watch.

<u>54</u> You go outside after you accepted Christ, the old crowd says, "You're no different. There's nothing different." But you believe you're different. Well, if you go say, "No, I guess I

<u>didn't get it." Well, you just got</u> <u>another trip to the altar coming.</u> <u>55</u> 23 But when you believe you have, you say, "Yes, I am." Then you believe vou're a Christian; vou can't show nothing that you are. But you believe you are. You believe you are. And then when you confess that you are, and when you confess Him,

<u>56</u> and He confesses you, He's a High Priest working on what? Not on your crying, not on your repenting, not on your faith, but on your confession. No matter how much faith you got, it'll never do you any good, till you put works with it.

<u>57</u> For faith without works is dead. Is that right? Just like this...The body without the spirit is dead. Then when you say, "I believe Christ," then accept it, go saying so. Then you believe you're a Christian; you say you're a Christian; you act like a Christian;

<u>60</u> anything that His redemptive blessings calls for, His sacrifice. That's what He paid for, and standing there to make good to you anything that you say, that you accepted what He has done. What was He done? He was wounded for your transgressions. Is that right?

61 Let's quote it together. [The congregation repeats after Brother Branham-Ed.] "He was wounded for our transgressions. He was bruised for our iniquity. The tres...our...was upon Him, and with His stripes we were healed." Is that right?

<u>62</u> 25 Now, any of those things, if you're weary, upset, fretting, nervous, sick, sin, whatever it is, when you accept that from your heart, go to confessing it, and then saving it's right, God's right there to make it right, when you go to confessing it.

66 And now remember, He's there, will make good anything that you believe in your heart that He has done and will confess it. <u>Then everywhere you go, testify</u> of your healing. Say so. Believe so. Tell others so.

<u>67</u> 26 And friends, it'll never fail. I've seen sarcomas cancer healed with it. And I know that it...You know what a sarcomas cancer is? All right. We got dozens, ves, piles of letters like that, from that type of cancer, files full of testimonies, doctor

80 But God has got a way of—of doing it. 76 Put them in a coop, you know what them ducks would know right now? Put them in a denomination like that,

<u>81</u> they knowed that they were ready for the slaughter. That's all. That's what you do when you put them together in a coop, they're going for the slaughter. The ducks got better sense than we got, on that.

<u>82</u> When you go to cooping them all up together in a man-made prison, well, then, you see, the duck knows he hasn't got his freedom to fly in the air, and do as God provided for him to do.

<u>83</u> And put him in a coop, then he-he is gone. That's all. You coop them when they're slaughtering. And the duck knows better. We ought to know.



77 Neither can you choose them a better route to go. Route, if you want to call it, up here, I think. Down home, in the South, it's still route, but up here I think they call it a route.

<u>85</u> Do you think, if you could say, "Now listen, I'll tell you what <u>you ought to do. You ought to</u> go back a certain way and come down another way, and down over this way."

48 Now, if you notice, Solomon never varied one bit from the pattern that Moses saw on Mount Sinai, in Heaven.

<u>151</u> Moses, when he returned from his vision, pitched the tent, and made it just exactly like he saw in Heaven.

<u>152</u>

And when Solomon built the temple, he made it just exactly the way he—he seen the pattern, the type.

153 Moses pitched the tent, for a-a perpetual type, because it was moved from place to

place.

154

But, Solomon, he made the—the tabernacle just exactly in the fashion that Moses had seen in Heaven. It was all put together, set in order, just exactly.

<u>155</u>

49 What a spiritual application we could apply here: that we are never to leave the Scripture. Stay exactly with the pattern.

<u>156</u>

That's the reason, I believe, that the way the first Church was patterned, that's the way the next One should be patterned,

<u>157</u>

that's the way every one should be patterned, just the way it was at the beginning. And I believe that God has it that way, I believe, the real Church. All right.

<u>158</u> 50 The materials, cut out in their native land, brought into one place. But when they were brought together...

<u>159</u>

I'm reading now from the 16th chapter, or quoting from it. Now, when they were brought together, they were so perfectly fit, that,

<u>160</u>

in the space of forty years that it taken to put the construction up, there wasn't one-one stone to be re-sawed.

<u>161</u>

There wasn't a buzz of a saw, or a sound of a hammer, for forty years. Talk about masonry, architecture!

<u>162</u>

51 Now, that showed, that, when we are doing anything, and doing it in the pattern that God has set for us...

<u>163</u> 52 Now, many of those stones looked very odd. But there was a place in the temple for every odd, peculiar stone. God had a place for them.

<u>164</u>

53 Our ministries, which is a beautiful type there, or an antitype to it, shows that, in our peculiarity, our way of worship.

<u>165</u>

Yet, when the Temple, the real Temple that we will come to after a few minutes, comes together, there will be a place for every odd-acting person.

<u>166</u>

We may look a little funny to someone else, and act a little funny; but, remember, it's the place there for us. God is cutting out His Church.

<u>167</u>

54 And every little stone had its place fit exactly to it. And remember, it was cut, away from the place it would be put together at;

<u>168</u>

but, when it come together, it didn't even need even honing. It was already honed. God had made it so it fit perfectly into its place.

<u>169</u> 55 Oh, what a type there we find, of the spiritual, how that every gift of God, every odd act of born-again Christians,

<u>170</u> in their peculiarity, yet it's got its place. It fits in the Body. It goes to its right place.

171 56 And many of us would—would try to say, "Now, that's not of God," a good, holy, consecrated soldier of the cross.

<u>172</u>

And we say, "Now, we stood in church the other night, and we heard such-and-such a thing. That can't be of God."

<u>173</u>

But if it's in line with the Pattern, if it's in a line with the Scripture, it may be odd, but it's going to have its place. See?

<u>174</u>

It'll fit right in, and it won't even need honing or polishing. It'll go to its place, for the great Architect, Christ, is preparing it now; odd, one to the other.

175 57 Now we notice, in the building down here, the next chapter, that, in this building, there was one stone that was actually too odd to fool with,

<u>176</u>

so the builders rejected it. So they just pitched it over into the corner, said, "That stone is actually too odd to be used. There's no such a place."

<u>177</u> 58 Now, remember, it was the builders who should have knowed different. Jesus spoke of it.

178 59 But, come to find out, they had built the building so high until they missed the stone. And they didn't know where that stone was.

<u>179</u>

They might have searched all the ships. They might have run through every ox cart. They might have sent messengers up into Joppa, and down, say, "Has another load come in?"

<u>180</u>

Or, "Did you lose one on the road? There's something wrong. We just can't find that stone for this place."

<u>181</u>

And when they could not find it, nowhere else, come to find out, it was right on the ground. It was the chief cornerstone that the builders rejected.

<u>182</u>

60 Jesus spoke of it, and said, "Have not you read of the stone that the builders rejected?

<u>183</u>

Was the chief cornerstone, the head of all of it, where the rest of the building rested upon it."

<u>184</u>

61 And I think, in the—the building today of the spiritual house that God worships in, I think that that's been a great big failure today among the builders.

<u>185</u>

We have come with our denominations, and we have laid them in sincerity. We have sent our boys to school, to educate them to speak well before a congregation,

<u>186</u>

learned them psychology and Bible history. And we have did everything, and built fine pews, and made high-towering steeples, and beautiful music, and so forth, have we built.

<u>187</u>

But we find out there's something wrong. We've tried to build it out of man-made material, what education could produce, what seminaries could bring out of them,

what scholarship. We tried to build it upon education, upon scholarship, upon denomination.

<u>189</u>

And all these things will not work as long as we have not accepted this odd Stone, this peculiar Stone.

190 62 But as the building begin to materialize, they realized that the hole that was left, the odd stone fit it, to the

dot.

191 63 That's, where, the spiritual builders today. And that's why the Bride building, of Christ, is not ready for the Bridegroom,

<u>192</u> is because that the builders has rejected the Chief Cornerstone that was laid on the Day of Pentecost, which is the baptism of the Holy Spirit. See?

<u>193</u>

It's been odd. People act funny. And they-they don't come into the order of our-of our psychology, of our educational, our learning, our creeds.

It don't fit in there. And they kicked It out, because It was too odd, too peculiar, too disagreeable with the-

the plans that we as men had, ideas of what the Church ought to be.

<u>196</u>

64 "It ought to be a group of polished scholars. It ought to be a group of fine-dressed people. It ought to be a group of something, where..."

197 We have tried to make it an educational program, or something that would please our five senses, something that we could see, or taste, or-or feel, or-or something.

Most of it has been through the sight. "Look at our fine people. Look at our best crowd in the city.

<u>199</u>

The mayor comes to our place. The—the chief executives of our city, the chief of police comes to our church."

<u>200</u>

65 And then we find out, when it comes down to actual, the-the building, all we've got is some mortar and rock.

<u>201</u>

And the Building did not go on. They rejected the Way, the Stone that God had so prepared for It. They rejected lt.

66 Now, we find out, oh, in the next chapter, that when the builders found out that they were wrong.

<u>203</u>

Yet, they had all the other stones there, but the reason they couldn't get them together was because there was a hole left. There was something that wasn't right. <u>204</u>

67 Now, we already have the stones, the stones God foreordained. See? And we've got them, all the way from Ephesus to Laodicea.

<u>205</u>

We're only waiting for that Headstone that the builders rejected, waiting for His Coming, the capping Stone. And when...

68 These great stones are confessions. Now, we know that confession is a stone. Now, the...

<u>207</u> 60-0309 - WHY?

108 I want to get on that this week, if I could: How that one

tries to impersonate another. You can never do that.

God never made two people alike. You just go the way the Holy Spirit leads you. We might take the millions that's in the world,

<u>209</u>

and no two of them has got the same thumb print. That's right. God made them different, He's a God of variety, He made them different.

Don't try to impersonate the next fellow, you do what God tells you to do, and stay with

it,

211 because there's no one in Heaven, or in earth can take your place, God made you for a purpose, stay with that.

<u>212</u> 109 Now, we find out that this medicine, when they inoculate this guinea pig, that was a animal they inoculate,

<u>213</u>

and then give the serum to a human being, it's not too sure. That inoculation might not work on you, but I say one thing: God's inoculation will work on you, it's perfect.

<u>214</u>

<u>60-0313 - HEAR YE HIM</u> 95 Do you know God never made two men the same?

There's no two of you in all the world, or ever has been,

that's got the same thumbprint. God makes men different, and He has diversities of gifts and sends them to His Church.

<u>216</u>

But we just cramp down on one, and there you go, you see, you don't get the wisdom of the Spirit, that's the reason God can't place us into the position where we should be in His Body.

217

For to one is given this sort of a gift, to another, this sort of a gift, to another one, another sort of a gift, and so forth, but all the same Body.

<u>218</u>

But we want to be just exactly like that other one, you can't do that, you must use the wisdom of the Word. The Bible is what our Blueprint is.

<u>219</u> 63-0412E - GOD HIDING HIMSELF IN SIMPLICITY 69 There's one place that man can meet and fellowship with God,

<u>220</u>

and fellowship with each other. That's under the cross, when each man accepts the Blood of Jesus Christ. I don't care, in all of his peculiarity,

<u>221</u> he can still reach over and put his hand in the next man's hand and call him "brother," when we meet at the cross where Jesus died.

<u>222</u> 51-0413 - THE WORKS THAT I **DO BEAR WITNESS OF ME** 26 But someday, you're going to have to...You remember, there's young people setting here.

<u>223</u> Someday those denominational barriers, and ideas that fanatics has got out there, and scooped around, and separated the people, will be taken away;

224

and God will bring His Church together and take It home. Just as certain as anything in the world. That's...They're going to come; that's prophecy. Remember that.

<u>225</u>

I spoke that in the Name of the Lord. Now, you can put that down upon the book. Now, that was true.

 $\frac{226}{1 didn't h}$

I didn't know I was saying, going to say that. Now, that's right. That's how God will bring His Church together.

<u>227</u>

You can depend on that And as long as you argue and fuss with one another, you're in the kindergarten. God will just keep you there, till you learn enough to get out of it.

<u>228</u>

That's all. Amen. Well, praise the Lord. All right. That's right. Get out. Have faith. Step out on the Word of God. Jesus said, "They..."

229 The disciples come, said, "We seen one casting out devils

and we forbid him." There

starts your denomination

again.

Said, "Forbid him not."

<u>230</u>

Amen. Be one with him; that's all. Go join up. If they won't join up, don't forbid him; go on. That's the way to do.

brethren who sees somebody that's convinced. I have the same respects to brethren who might disagree with me. I-I would say, certainly I respect his...

<u>238</u> 57-0807 - HEAR YE HIM 29 I'm forty-eight years old. I never was invited to join the Branham family. Why? I was borned in the Branham family.

<u>239</u> I become a Branham by birth. That's the way we become a child of God. Is not by Methodist, Presbyterian, nor Anglican, or Pentecostal, Nazarene, Pilgrim Holiness.

We are born by the Spirit of God into the church of the living God. Certainly is.

<u>241</u>

And then our character is watched by the Holy Spirit. And if we're Methodist today, and they make us a little mad, and we go over to the Baptists the next day,

<u>242</u>

and they fuss at us a little bit, and something, the preacher says something steps on your toe, then away you go down to Pilgrim Holiness,

<u>243</u>

or Nazarenes, or somewhere like that. No wonder. You pack your paper from place to place till it's about tore

up.

244

Why don't you take your name off of it anyhow and put it on the Lamb's Book of Life? Let God take care of it and fellowship with all the brethren of like precious faith. <u>245</u>

Whether you see eye to eye alike that doesn't matter. We're at least Christians, brethren, borned in the same family.

God received us in our peculiarities; we should receive each other.

<u>247</u> <u>60-0221 - HEARING, RECOGNIZING,</u> ACTING ON THE WORD OF GOD 1 Now, these tapes, that of this meeting this morning, is not sold,

<u>248</u>

it's just for the Church or for someone, 'cause it's on Doctrine. And in the meetings out there, it causes confusion, because hardly two of us see perfectly eye to eye,

<u>249</u>

but we ought to be heart to heart, anyhow. But it, we in the tabernacle here, these tapes are, you notice on the...It's for just friends, and so forth.

<u>250</u> <u>64-0119 - SHALOM</u> 209 It's an individual affair, you and God. There is no two man see eye to eye, together alike; no two thumbs alike.

251 God deals with a i

God deals with a individual. And how you know whether he is right or not? Then look back and see if he is with the Word.

<u>252</u> If he is with the Word, then God is dealing with him; if he isn't, something else is dealing with him. See? That's right.

253 53-0216 - MY ANGEL SHALL GO BEFORE THEE

12 Jeremiah, the prophet, God said, "Before you was even formed in your mother's womb,

<u>254</u>

I knew you, and sanctified you, and ordained you a prophet over the nations." Is that right? Before he ever come from his mother's womb...

<u>255</u>

See, gifts and callings are without repentance. See? God gives them. You can't help 'cause you have blue eyes, all "who, taking thought can add one cubit to his stature."

<u>256</u>

Therefore the thing has got out into the world today with a bunch of "ism," you see, and it absolutely,

<u>278</u> There is a revival in town. That revival is there for a purpose. Let's get something out of it. Let's do something about it.
